AughtyMarie has A LOT of things she'd like to be when she grows up, including a doctor, a veterinarian, and a teacher, but her "biggest" first grade dream: to be a person who speaks to other people...about God!

The difference maker in the Becraft Scholars program is that we lead with the unifying power of relationship. The relationshipcentered focus of the program recognizes that all families have so much to offer one another in their schools.

All Becraft families volunteer in their children's Catholic schools and

support one another by building community in engaging, lifegiving ways. The Fulcrum-Becraft relationship isn't transactional—we recognize that our community thrives when each individual is loved, supported, and given an opportunity to use their God-given gifts.

Believing in Hope

For more than 12 years, I have managed Fulcrum's programs, the largest of which is the Tuition Assistance Grant Program, commonly called TAP. Each year, thousands of parents apply for TAP, seeking financial assistance to help make their dream of a Catholic education for their children a reality. In these applications, I hear from parents facing job loss, underemployment, and illness, families torn apart by addiction and absent parents, and those struggling to make ends meet even though they are working full time, sometimes working two or three jobs.

Fulcrum desperately wants to help them all, to ease their burden, and be an answer to their prayers. We look forward to serving more and more families through TAP with the support of our generous donors.

One of the hardest things we do as human beings is to ask for help. It takes courage, vulnerability and hope to make it worthwhile. No matter what parents are facing, no matter how hard things are, I am always struck by the hope they have for their children, their family, and their future. At its core, hope is the belief in possibility.
